Beyond Access: Ethical, Sustainable, and Activist Perspectives in Global Digital Mental Health

Workshop, March 26–27, 2026 University of Zurich, Switzerland

This two-day workshop brings together researchers and practitioners to critically examine how digital mental health tools can be developed and implemented in fair, responsible, and inclusive ways.

Participation without presenting is also welcome.

Selection & Fees: To maintain a collaborative and interactive workshop atmosphere, participation is limited. If applications exceed available places, participants will be selected based on the fit of their abstracts with the workshop themes and the goal of creating a balanced and diverse program. Please note that participants are responsible for organizing and covering their own travel and accommodation.

Travel and Accommodation Guide for the University of Zurich, Switzerland

For decades, the University of Zurich (UZH), Switzerland's largest university, has been a leading center for research and teaching in Europe. Its strong international orientation, interdisciplinary collaboration, and commitment to academic innovation make it an ideal venue for exploring pressing questions shaping Europe's future.

Getting there from within Zurich:

The University of Zurich's City Campus (Zentrum) is located along Rämistrasse in the university quarter, adjacent to Zurich's historic city center. It is well connected to the city's public transport network. From Zurich Hauptbahnhof (main station), several tram lines provide direct access:

- Tram 6 (direction Zoo)
- Tram 10 (direction Zürich Flughafen or Oerlikon Bahnhof)
- Tram 3 (direction Klusplatz)
- Tram 15 (direction Klusplatz)

Travel time is typically 5–7 minutes. The most convenient stops for the central UZH buildings (such as KOL, KOH, RAI, RAA) include ETH/Universitätsspital, Kantonsschule, and Universitätsspital. From these stops, the main university facilities are within a 2–5 minute walk. Walking from Zurich Hauptbahnhof is also feasible, taking approximately 15–20 minutes through the old town and up a gentle incline.

Getting there from other parts of Switzerland:

Zurich is a major rail hub with high-frequency connections from all major Swiss cities. Direct trains to Zurich Hauptbahnhof operate multiple times per hour from Bern, Basel, Lucerne, St. Gallen, Lausanne, and Geneva. Travelers can plan routes using the Swiss Federal Railways (SBB) website or app.

Getting there from abroad:

Attendees arriving by air will land at Zurich Airport (ZRH). The airport is directly linked to the national rail system, with trains to Zurich Hauptbahnhof departing every few minutes and requiring about 10 minutes of travel time. From the main station, trams provide fast and reliable onward connections to the City Campus. An alternative is tram 10, which runs directly from Zurich Airport to the university area. The journey takes approximately 35 minutes, and passengers can alight at ETH/Universitätsspital for immediate access to the campus.
